

Green light for the Tarvisio Audi FIS Ski World Cup

Snow Control successfully passed on the Di Prampero course:
FIS gives final approval for the January 17–18, 2026 races

Tarvisio, 4 January 2026 – Green light for the Tarvisio stop of the **Audi FIS Ski World Cup 2026**. On the morning of Sunday, 4 January, the International Ski and Snowboard Federation carried out the customary Snow Control, the mandatory inspection of the snow conditions on the race course that will host the women's Audi FIS Ski World Cup events. The inspection was carried out on the **Di Prampero** course and returned a positive outcome, allowing the Organising Committee to proceed with the final preparation of the track, which on 17 and 18 January 2026 will host the two speed events: **Downhill** and **Super G**.

The event is promoted by the Friuli Venezia Giulia Region through PromoTurismoFVG, with the support of FIS, FISU, the Municipality of Tarvisio and the Tourism Promotion Consortium of the Tarvisiano, Sella Nevea and Passo Pramollo areas. The Snow Control was carried out along the entire race course, from the Monte Lussari hamlet down to the Camporosso finish area, by **Alberto Senigagliales**, FIS Race Director World Cup Women Speed Events, accompanied by **Giorgio Kaidisch**, Project Manager of the Tarvisio Audi FIS Ski World Cup Organising Committee, **Luca Berti**, Chief of Race, **Fabio Toscan**, Ski Resort Tarvisio Director, and technicians from PromoTurismoFVG.

Work can now continue at full pace to fine-tune all aspects of the course preparation, the Organising Committee explained. Snow conditions are positive and allow the next stages of preparation to be approached with confidence ahead of the event. In the coming days, organisational and logistical activities related to infrastructure and operational areas will also continue, alongside the technical preparation of the course. The full programme spans five days, including team arrivals, official training sessions and races.

National teams will arrive in Tarvisio on **Wednesday, 14 January**, a day dedicated to accreditation and the start of organisational activities. Official training sessions are scheduled for **Thursday, 15 January** and **Friday, 16 January**, with two sessions on the Di Prampero course, essential for athletes to familiarise themselves with the track. The races will take place over the weekend: **Saturday, 17 January**, will feature the **Downhill**, starting at **10:45 am**, while **Sunday, 18 January**, will conclude with the **Super G**, starting at **11:15 am**. To allow for course preparation and to ensure the safe staging of the races, the **Di Prampero** course will be closed to the public from **7 to 19 January 2026 (inclusive)**. During this period, access to the race areas will be permitted exclusively to authorised personnel. The Monte Lussari cable car will remain open at all times, both for pedestrians heading to the village and for skiers wishing to access the rest of the Tarvisio ski area. The course occupation schedule will be continuously updated in real time on the **Infoneve** section of the official channels.

With the FIS approval granted, Tarvisio officially enters the final countdown phase toward one of the most eagerly awaited events of the women's World Cup season, ready to welcome athletes, teams, officials and an international audience, with the 1,000-seat grandstands already sold out for both race days.
